

Revelation 2:1–7 (NIV)

“To the angel of the church in Ephesus write:

These are the words of him who holds the seven stars in his right hand and walks among the seven golden lampstands. <sup>2</sup> I know your deeds, your hard work and your perseverance. I know that you cannot tolerate wicked people, that you have tested those who claim to be apostles but are not, and have found them false. <sup>3</sup> You have persevered and have endured hardships for my name, and have not grown weary.

<sup>4</sup> Yet I hold this against you: You have forsaken the love you had at first. <sup>5</sup> Consider how far you have fallen! Repent and do the things you did at first. If you do not repent, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place. <sup>6</sup> But you have this in your favor: You hate the practices of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate.

<sup>7</sup> Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To the one who is victorious, I will give the right to eat from the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God.

Prophetic Oracle / Royal Edict

Angel – Heavenly Spiritual Being tasked with protecting and representing the church in a certain area. Also stands as the spiritual representative of the identity of the church, the message is given to the angel for the whole church.

Context: **The City of Ephesus**

- One of the four most powerful and influential cities of the Roman Empire
- The Chief city of the Roman Province of Asia Minor with a population upwards of 250,000 people
- It was famed for its temple to Artemis the Goddess of fertility, the “Artemision”. One of the seven wonders of the ancient world, it lay just outside the city and was the largest temple in the Roman Empire. Over 100,000 square feet with 127 marble pillars 60 feet high it was four times the size of the Parthenon in Athens and twice the size of a football field.
- Paul help to found the church. He left Priscilla and Aquila to help establish the church. He later returned and spent over two years in Ephesus teaching and encouraging the church. He was forced to flee the city because the spread of the gospel disrupted the sale of idols of Artemis and so the smiths rose up and shouted “Great is Artemis of the Ephesians,” and caused a riot in the streets. Ephesus became a central hub of spreading the gospel. Timothy was sent to help the church deal with false teaching. Later the apostle John would become the leading pastor of the church.

## Prophetic Identity and Character of Christ
