

The Life of Jesus According to Luke: An Introductory Dialogue

Luke, a Greek physician and the only Gentile author of Scripture, wrote down his testimony to Jesus Christ and dedicated it to his friend, Theophilus, (which means “lover of God”). He called it a “Gospel” (“Good News!”)! This is an account of how God’s plan of saving the whole world from sin and death had begun. Understanding the life of Jesus is the basic beginning point for any disciple of Jesus. In this eight week seminar, we are going to look at the life of Jesus together, trying to grasp the big picture of Luke’s story as well as build a framework for understanding the revelation of Jesus Christ. The format will include, teaching, small group discussion, large group discussion, and prayer. Come listen afresh to the Good News of Jesus Christ according to Luke: our goal is to grow as “lovers of God.”

We are called to go and make disciples of Jesus Christ! This is the main mission given to the church, given to a person who professes that Jesus is Savior and Lord. If you were to ask almost any Christian, there would be real bewilderment on how to go about “making a disciple”. This is a continuation of the Fall session of Wednesdays@West Side. We will continue to share a vision of becoming a church of disciple-makers as well as foundational principles and approaches of being a disciple and then helping others grow and become disciple-makers themselves. There has been a team of people working on invigorating the way we approach following Jesus in our church. At this seminar, you will not only have the chance to hear about some of this work, but we hope that your life will change as you begin to see more clearly what and how discipleship works.

Jesus Before He Came - Part II

Continuing our journey through the Old Testament, we will focus on how Jesus’ life and ministry were foreshadowed and prophesied during the reigns of the kings of Israel and Judah and by the post-exilic prophets. We will begin with the books of 1 and 2 Samuel; introduce Job, Psalms, and Proverbs; and examine several minor and major prophets. Though this is Part II of our overview of the Old Testament, those who weren’t with us for the Fall session of Wednesdays@West Side are still welcome and will enjoy exploring the ways in which God prepared the coming of his Son. In preparation for class, please read 1 and 2 Samuel.
